At the moment we continue to follow the Cof E guidance for Step 4 which was updated on 19th July. Bishop Graham writes:

"The virus has not gone away. I wear a face covering not for myself but to protect other people; I keep a distance to ensure that you are safe; I am lateral flow testing twice each week to protect my colleagues and family. I am conscious that people will have very different views. I hope that we can engender a sense of loving kindness during these days, respecting those who are nervous or who, even having been double jabbed, have additional risks and vulnerabilities. In the messiness of it all we will need to keep trying to live as the body of Christ.

"I hope that people will read and reflect on all that has been said in the Church of England guidance. Please remember that the advice sets out what is possible and not what has to be done. Changes do not need to be introduced all at once, and certainly not by this coming Sunday."

Deanery News

Jan Willson has joined the Deanery Synod to represent the Grimston congregation. She has also been elected as Lay Chair of that Synod (Nell Steele held the post until recently).

Diocesan Synod representatives for the Deanery have been appointed for the next three years. Nell continues in this role and is joined by Chris Sykes of Congham and two other lay members from King's Lynn..

This summer is also the time to elect members to the General Synod. For the first time elections will be held electronically between Friday 17th September and Friday 8th October 2021.

The Church Army Mission in King's Lynn was set up in2017, initially for a four year period. James Hawksworth of the Church Army worked in King's Lynn and also Springwood High School Sadly, due to financial pressures exacerbated by the Covid pandemic, the Diocese has made the difficult decision to bring the project to a close on 15th October 2021.

James Nash, the Rural Dean writes: I am very sorry to be bringing this news to you, especially because it affects our friend and colleague James Hawksworth and his family. James is currently working out a 3 month notice period and I believe he hopes and expects that the Church Army will re-deploy him.
